Abstract of doctoral dissertation

“Limits of the continuity of administrative enforcement proceedings“

written under the supervision of prof. dr hab. Barbara Adamiak

The concentration of research in the area of the limits of the continuity of administrative enforcement proceedings allowed to draw conclusions and formulate some theoretical generalizations. The considerations of the work were divided into several research areas.

The aim of the first research area was to clarify the concept of continuity of administrative enforcement proceedings. It was decided to present views on its understanding in two spheres. The first one covered the achievements of sciences such as praxeology, sociology, and the science of administration. The second one focused on the legal understanding of the concept of continuity of proceedings.

In order to present and understand the principle of continuity in the normative sphere, a review of the areas of law in which the existence of this principle can be seen was carried out. When discussing the principle of continuity in administrative enforcement proceedings, it was noted that it is closely related to the general principle of speed of proceedings. It serves to achieve the intended goal. It was assumed that it can have a positive and negative dimension. The positive dimension indicates and describes situations when continuity is maintained. Looking at the continuity of proceedings in terms of interruptions in its course creates a negative approach to the principle of continuity.

The considerations in the second research area focused on the juxtaposition of the relationship between enforcement proceedings and administrative enforcement and the
