International Criminal Court

first permanent treaty-based international tribunal to deal with individual criminal responsibility for the most serious international crimes

Headquarters: Hague

Main act: Rome Statute, adopted on July 17, 1998



Jurisdiction and admissibility

- **principle of complementarity** with regard to national criminal proceedings, meaning that the ICC will only investigate and prosecute cases in which national courts are unwilling or unable genuinely to investigate or prosecute (Art. 17 (1) Rome Statute)
- primacy of national prosecutions



Jurisdiction and admissibility

- jurisdiction ratione materiae:
 - the crime of genocide
 - crimes against humanity
 - war crimes
 - the crime of aggression



Jurisdiction and admissibility

- jurisdiction ratione temporis:
 - no retrospective jurisdiction the Court can only deal with crimes committed after July 1, 2002, when the Rome Statute came into force
- jurisdiction ratione loci and ratione personae:
 - crimes committed on the territory of a state which has ratified the treaty; or by a citizen of such a state; or when the United Nations Security Council refers a case to it
