SCOPE

- Prof. Krzan SUBSTANTIVE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL LAW
 - set of provisions describing forms of conduc (crimes) that have an associated punishmen (penalty) or security measure due to their socially intolerable character
- Dr Kremens INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
 - set of legally regulated actions undertaken with a view to detect an offence and the offende (suspect, accused, perpetrator of a crime) putting the offender on trial, issuing a verdic regarding the offender's criminal liability and possibly, carrying out a sentence or othe measures
